## Growing Orchids With Olivier Situational Care



#### **Philosophical** aspects of growing orchids

We live in a world of instant gratification, courtesy of the internet and the

sophistication of computers that give us access to anything we want or desire at the click of a mouse. Soon, AI may well create fantasies and illusions to satisfy our craziest cravings.

We also live in a world of "shorttermness". Our culture favors achievements that are readily achievable while hard decisions that would benefit us in the long term are always put on the backburner.

We live in a world where instant and enormous success is possible when you see some billionaires that are 25 years old. Yet, this is true for 1 in 100 million people. Some of the other 100 million just keep on hoping the winning ticket will show up one day ....

For most everyone though, life is about efforts and building patiently and gradually: a family, a loving relationship with your spouse, a career, assets etc.... Life is about persevering in the long run to achieve your goals. Orchids are a marvelous teaching instrument in that regard.

Growing orchids requires patience, A LOT OF PATIENCE. Any new orchid in your collection is likely to need 2 years to be well established. Some species need 5 to 10 years or more to be well established. It takes a lot of care with an eye to the long term to achieve results with orchids. It also takes time to learn all the infinite complexities of growing these beautiful plants and you still learn every day even when you think In the end, it is a healthy addiction, you understand what you are doing!

The beauty of it all is that, unlike many things in life, orchids get better as they age: more blooms, better blooms, bigger blooms etc... So, it pays to be patient and the rewards are plentiful in the long term.

Also, the orchid world is endlessly complex and even with a few extra lives, we would still not master the subject. So, orchids are a useful reminder that we need to keep on learning every day because in the end, by the time we die, we still know basically nothing....but just a lot more than when we were born.

Another aspect of Orchid growing is that it becomes an addiction for many. Many hobbyists have hundreds of orchids or more! While an outsider might consider this ludicrous and excessive, there are good reasons for this:

- The variety is infinite, hence the temptation to buy so many
- The number of failures is very high for a beginner and without a large collection, it would be too discouraging
- Many plants only bloom once a year and, sometimes, for a short period of time. So, having many orchids is the only way to get blooms year-round

except for the wallet. My orchids have cured countless headaches. All it takes is for me to go spend 30 minutes in my orchid jungle and I am back on track. They make me happy!

So, orchids remind us of a very important thing in life: nothing worth having comes without efforts and most of the time, efforts have to be sustained and you go through ups and downs before reaching your goals. So, this is another positive aspect of the addiction: a useful life lesson!
